This album is a marriage of music, teste and performance. Tony Bennett, one of America's linest entertainers, loves, admires, respects and cherishes the constantly surprising refrains in the brilliant matching of Rodgers and Hart. They are, without argument, the definitive music comedy collaborators of the truly Golden Age of the Broadway Theatre. You recognize love and respect in every decibel, in the timbre of Tony Bennett's tones, his perfect interpretations. Buby Braff's flawless coronet, George Barnes' matchiess guitar and the rest of the group, form a sparkling setting for Tony's gem-like performance.

A Hart-felt lyric often spins into brilliantly iconoclastic reverse. Not the obvious "I Love You" would satisfy Larry Hart: the poignant, touching breezily witty. This Can't Be Love, celebrates romance; but doubts it, "because I feel so well-no sobs, no sorrows, no sighs" The Lady is a Tramp celebrates not a tramp, but a free young natural lady, whose dismissal of spurious, pretentious chic, announces it is not for her. The finest of natural ordinariness is lifted to English. Dick Rodgers' inimitable genius, shines through the melodious, silken, linear delights of each song. Manhattan, from their first real hit, "Garrick Galeties", celebrates the glamorous borough of New York in story and slang. Unlike any love song before, it is a valentine to Manhattan, not just any young girl. Spring brilliantly. Spring indeed is here, but "Why Doesn't My Heart Go Dancing?", ending with a lovely rueful "Spring is Here---romance, proving wit wasn't all; that his cleverness had depth. Lover is exciting, erotic, evocative. Have You Met Miss Jones? is the different Hart-line lyric in which an introduction beautifully frames a lad in love's deepest idolatry. Isn't it Romantic?, was!-is!-forever! Wait 'Til You See Her is a promissory musical note the promise fulfilled. I Could Write a Book construction, starting with preface, plot, and bookends, all of which made two lovers of friends.

The joining of Dick Rodgers' rich, charming, brilliant and triumphant music with Larry Hart's wit and wonderment, and Tony Bennett's compelling talents, makes this album a classic—warm and loving, exciting and sweet. This can be love; spring is here; yes, we've met Miss Jones and she is ours; indeed it is romantic; we don't have to wait to see her, we hear her.

I could write a book about Rodgers, Hart and Bennett; but this funny, fond Valentine will have to do. They happen only once in a Blue Moon.
